On November 30, 2020 the Boards of Directors of the Chilmark Pond Foundation and Great Pond Foundation announced a collaboration to develop a *science-based ecological restoration program* for Chilmark Pond. Additionally, on January 5, 2021, the Chilmark Conservation Commission conditionally approved the CPF's project to improve the exchange of water by dredging sand from the cut area and deepening channels in the lower pond. Improving the effectiveness of openings to drain and flush the pond is a scientifically recommended strategy to improve shellfish and diadromus fish habitat and the water quality of Chilmark Pond. This is the first step in achieving several necessary project approvals.
